

SUMMER 2024 MEALS AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS

The Central Dauphin School District will be operating the Seamless Summer Option, a provision of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), which allows the district to provide school meals at no cost to students during the summer break. The program is **FREE to all children 18 years of age and under**. Parents should accompany small children. No advance sign up is needed. Children should have the ability to chew food. Infant food is not available. Meals are intended to be eaten on-site.

School meals will be provided at **TRI-COMMUNITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**, 255 Cypress Street, Bressler, PA 17113, and **CENTRAL DAUPHIN EAST HIGH SCHOOL**, 626 Rutherford Road, Harrisburg, PA 17109. School meals will be offered on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of each week starting on Tuesday, June 18th until Thursday, August 15th. Breakfast will be available between 8:30-9:30AM and lunch will be available between 11:30AM-12:30PM.
