

Student Assistance Program (SAP)

The Pennsylvania Student Assistance Program (SAP) is a systematic team process used to mobilize school resources to remove barriers to learning. SAP is designed to assist in identifying issues including alcohol, tobacco, other drugs, and mental health issues which pose a barrier to a student's success.

SAP team members must participate in a three day training provided by a state approved trainer.

Every building, including the CD Cyber Academy, has a SAP team.

SAP Audit being conducted to identify needs of current teams and ways to streamline the process.

True North Wellness

School Based Therapy

School Based outpatient therapy is **mental health therapy provided at school during the course of the student's day**. The student is referred to a school based therapist who will see the student during the school day for individual therapy for identified behavioral health problems.

True North Counselor comes to the school building during the school day to provide outpatient counseling services.

Paid for through the student's insurance.



Communities in Schools

Evidence-based model connects students to caring adults and community resources.

Empower students to confront and overcome personal challenges and structural barriers—so they can take charge of the future they want for themselves, their communities and each other.

Site Coordinators currently assigned to East Middle School, Swatara Middle School, and East High School.

3 Surveys - Student, Community, Teacher/Staff






Family-School Relationship Survey


Continue a focus on building safety and providing support for students who might be at risk to harm others.

The facilities are always clean


I love the amount of communication and availability and support from the teachers . I feel like I am always aware of what's going on with my kids in school. My kids feel very comfortable and safe in this school district.

Open Ended Response

If you could change one thing about this school or district, what would it be?

We need to do more as a school community to celebrate diversity .

Offer sports and a second language since kindergarten. Also a full day kindergarten is crucial for early education development and growth.

Retention of teachers. There are too many leaving for other districts. What are we doing to make this the best job for them?

More employees/ staff to serve the needs of the students (more counselors, more school psychologists, more teachers, more paras, etc).

More mental health professionals on staff to help the students when they are struggling. It's too easy for kids to slip through the cracks if they aren't exhibiting extreme behavior. Many kids suffer silently from mental stress, depression and anxiety.

Stronger focus on social-emotional

More STEAM and music opportunities .

I would increase the opportunities for students to access more elective courses so they may "try out" multiple fields of study and uncover their aptitude and affinity for various fields before committing to college majors and/or career choices.

I would like more communication from the teachers .
