Dear Parents,

The Dauphin County Library System (The Library) and the Central Dauphin School District have formed a new partnership while schools and The Library are closed due to COVID-19. With this partnership, CD students can use their school ID number to access The Library's eResources. While students are attempting to finish out the year at home, these resources can support their education and are accessible 24/7.

We call this initiative [All Ready Access](#), because with just their school ID number, students already have the access they need.

Here are some important things for you to know:

- **Your student is already enrolled.** If you do NOT wish your child to have access to these resources, you can opt out. See the opt-out form on the back of this letter.
- **Your student's login is the abbreviation CD followed by their school ID number.** The default PIN is the last 4 digits of their school ID number. See the All Ready Access brochure for full instructions.
- **All Ready Access allows students to borrow eResources** and access The Library's [databases](#), just like any library card. It does not allow them to borrow physical books or other materials.
- **Your student will not gain fines with an All Ready Access account.** To borrow physical books or other materials, or to use the computers at The Library, your student's account will need to be converted into a regular library card. Once the libraries are open again, stop by any library with your student and your ID to upgrade to full library access.
- **If your student already has a card at The Library, we will combine the two accounts**, and your student can use either the library barcode or the school ID number to access online resources. See the All Ready Access digital brochure for more information.
- **Your student's information is secure.** Your student's privacy and security are of the utmost importance to the Central Dauphin School District and The Library. All information provided by the district is considered confidential under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). The Library agrees to keep that information confidential and will not use it for anything other than the creation of an All Ready Access account for your student.

It is our hope that this partnership and these resources are useful to you while finishing out the school year. This partnership will continue into the next school year, too. At the start of the 2020/2021 school year in the fall, we'll be sending out updated information.

### You're *already* enrolled!

To access The Library's eResources, just log in:

1. Visit [dcls.org](https://dcls.org)
2. Tap or click on Library Account Login at the top of the page
3. In the Barcode box, enter CD followed by your student ID number (don't add any spaces.) This is your All Ready Access account number.
4. For your PIN, enter the last 4 digits of your student ID number (you can change this later if you'd like.) If you already have a library card, your PIN has not changed, and both your student ID number and your library card number are attached to your account.

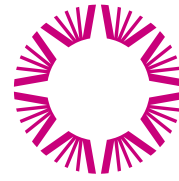
